Our goal

The goal WEXHE aims to achieve is two-fold: to help bridge the gap between practical and theoretical learning in HE, and skills set of graduates and the skills they require in their early careers.

How does WEXHE project realise this goal?

EXPLORATION

The consortium will identify and analyse current provision of work experience in HEIs in 7 different EU countries; by generating 84 case studies of work-based learning (WBL), that involve four types of disciplinary sectors, covering work placements, traineeships and entrepreneurship. The four domains will target the following broad areas of study:

- Hard-Pure: Pure (Life) Sciences
- Soft-Pure: Humanities
- Hard-Applied: Engineering
- Soft-Applied: Applied Social Sciences

DEVELOPMENT

The consortium will create 12 replicable modules of WBL, with guidance on management, quality assurance, learning outcomes, funding, and accreditation working with practitioners.

CAPACITY BUILDING

The consortium will provide training to trainers in HEIs and Businesses as well as series of workshops targeted to policy makers to develop the models further and raise awareness at the EU level.
